

# Recent developments

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## Human Fertility Database:

- Adding easily accessible set of selected summary indicators for all countries in an Excel file
- Including first Latin American country, Chile (1992-2005 only)

## Human Fertility Collection:

- Rapid expansion, focusing especially on important countries
- Developing network of data providers for Latin America



## Future plans: different areas

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- Expanding data and country coverage
- Developing or adjusting methodology
- Expanding the range of HFC dimensions
- Making the HFD more up to date
- Improving of data presentation



# Methodological challenges

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## Human Fertility Database:

- Inclusion of “non-HMD” countries in the HFD: to generate standardised population estimates a full package of the HMD methodology need to be applied, incl. the data checking procedure
- New method for splitting aggregated age groups into one-year groups

## Human Fertility Collection:

- Challenges in splitting age-grouped data for youngest age groups (<20)
- Splitting aggregated age groups for birth order data (to be implemented by next update)
- New method for splitting aggregated age groups into one-year groups – same as for the HFD



# New Indicators and Dimensions

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## Human Fertility Database:

- We collect statistics of downloaded indicators. Should some of them be removed due to little or no use?
- We can also add more indicators based on the existing data. If so, which ones?
- Extending of the “HFD-lite” for non-professional users?

## Human Fertility Collection:

- Adding sub-national data
- Adding selected dimensions: ethnicity, race, citizenship/migration status and urban/rural residence (dimensions discussed but not agreed: marital status)
- Longer-term plans: adding cohort data, period data by birth order and duration since previous birth (“birth intervals”)



# New Data

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## Human Fertility Database:

- Annual or biannual update for all countries included in the HFD. Annual update for top priority countries.
- New countries, coming soon: Italy, Spain, Ireland, Denmark, Latvia.
- New countries on the “waiting list” : Australia, Israel, Greece, Moldova, New Zealand, Poland, Romania, South Korea

## Human Fertility Collection:

- New countries, coming soon: Bangladesh, China, Fiji, India, Iran, Mexico
- Priority countries not yet included the HFC: Egypt, Indonesia, Philippines, Pakistan, Thailand
- Expansion priorities: adding historical data (potential data source: INED library) and alternative estimates for problematic countries
- Extending Latin American coverage

## Data Presentation (web site)

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### Human Fertility Database:

- No changes currently planned

### Human Fertility Collection:

- *Data mapping:* Adding simple graphs of period TFR and MAB for all available datasets for every country
- Adaptation of current web structure to new data dimensions (region, residence, ethnicity, etc.)


