In the 2002 Census, the number of women by parity was not published if the number in a given age and parity category was small. The data were classified as confidential. Therefore, some figures for the ages 21–31 and for women at parities 3 and 4+ were substituted with a missing value. These figures were re-estimated by the HFD team using the totals by age and birth order.

2

In the 1953 Census, the number of women by parity at the ages 35–49 was published only by 5-year age groups. Therefore, we include the number of women by single years of age but without parity for the same age range.

3

In the 1961 Census, the number of women by parity was published only by 5-year age groups. Therefore, we include the number of women by single years of age but without parity for the age range 15–49. However, the totals summed in 5-years groups from this data do not always match the parity-specific data. For the unknown reason, the totals differ from 1 to 4 women in some 5-year age groups.

In the 2002 Census, the number of women by parity was published only for the whole age group 15–19. The numbers for single-year age groups were re-estimated by the HFD team from the totals of women by single age, totals of women by parity in the age group 15–19, and the distribution of women by parity and age in the 1991 census, using the Iterative Proportional Fitting method (see the HFD Methods Protocol, section 4.4, for details).
